

ABOUT THE COLLEGE



t is twenty-five years since our Netaji Satabarshiki Mahavidyalaya began its humble journey and indeed in all these years it has carefully built brick by brick an edifice of education and has been nurturing students with purpose and passion and paving the path for opportunities and success. Starting as an affiliated college under the University of Calcutta in 2000, the affiliation of the college was switched to West Bengal State University at Barasat since 2008 like all the other 57 colleges of the district. Now, the college has a three-storied building comprising of 20 classrooms (with Wi-Fi facilities) at present and four specific rooms/computer labs have been allotted to the departments of Geography, Music, Journalism & Mass Communication and Physical Education.

Besides, the college has one seminar room and three class rooms with ICT facilities. The fully automated college library with its spacious reading room provides the students a wide array of books and materials that facilitates the learning process coupled with internet connectivity. It has an air-conditioned stack room for better upkeep of books and periodicals. Presently, the student strength of the college is around fifteen hundred. The teaching-learning-evaluation infrastructure and ambience of the college are conducive to academic upliftment. It has struck an exemplary chord among the neighboring schools and colleges. The results of university examinations over the years speak of our achievement despite having a serious shortage of funds, manpower, and infrastructure. Over the years, the reputation of the college has spread far and wide and it has consistently attracted students from distant areas and diverse strata of the society who routinely vie for admission each year to become a part of this august institution.

Presently, the college offers 4 YEAR Major course in ten subjects in B.A. and B.Sc.: Bengali, English, History, Political Science, Geography, Journalism and Mass Comm, Sociology, Music, Sanskrit, and Education. There are thirteen (13) Minor subjects available in B.A. and B.Sc.: Bengali, English, History, Political Science, Geography, Sociology, Education, Physical Education, Economics, Sanskrit, Music, Journalism and Mass Communication and Mathematics. A computer course (as a MDC Course) has been initiated under the supervision of NIELIT at a reasonable cost.

The college has a decent Students' Union building along with a boys' and a girls' common room within the campus. The college canteen provides a variety of food items at a reasonable price to the staff and students.

The motto of the college has unflaggingly remained to impart the best with the least means. The college has been accorded 2(f) and 12B status by the UGC.

There is no denying that the college is heading for excellence. It has a Minority Cell, Career Counseling Cell, Research Committee, RTI Section and Internal Complaints Committee. The NSS Unit of the college is working sincerely and reaching out to the neighbouring community of people. The college is linked with the Students' Health Home that caters to the medical needs of the students. As a part of the Social Outreach Programme various beneficial activities have been carried out at Wards no. 6, 9, 17, 22 of Ashoknagar Municipality by our college.

Since the institution's inception, the students of the college have made their mark in the fields of games and sports. Their achievements are lauded with trophies and awards in various fields and they have successfully participated and contributed to national events representing the university. The students from the Department of Music have also made tremendous achievements by participating in various college and university level competitions. Students from this department have also become university toppers.

The college library is steadily being upgraded on all fronts with infrastructural developments - books, journals, magazines, and e-resources. Presently the number of books in the college library stands at around 12,600 along with institutional subscriptions to 3 hard copy leading journals and many more online journals. The library provides computer facilities along with reading room facilities to staff and students. Apart from the central library there are departmental libraries of the Major subjects which cater to the specific needs of the faculties and students of the respective subjects.

The college Governing Body was formed in 2008 and has been providing adequate guidance in the functioning of the college. The Students' Council is also quite cooperative and lends effective support in conducting all academic and administrative matters concerning students.

Since the 2014-15 academic session, the college has adopted online admission system prior to the Higher Education notification of 2015-16 which has enormously saved time and provided opportunity to avoid hazards of the otherwise cumbersome process.

The college received a donation of Rs.10,000/-from the eldest son of late Dr. Sadhan Sen to allot-award/prizes to two best students of the final year—one from Core and the other from General course. The annual award ceremony is organised in the month of January every year to celebrate the achievements of our students. In this ceremony all subject toppers are also awarded.

On a positive note, the future of the college holds the promise of excellence by moving ahead with the prospect of introducing new courses, both in B.A. and B.Sc. The 4 Year Major UG programme and 3 year Multidisciplinary UG programme under NEP have rolled out from the 2023-24 session to facilitate greater flexibility in the choice of subjects, the college can offer to the enrolled students. We look forward to marching towards academic excellence in coming days. For this to happen all concerned – students, staff, faculty and management—will have to work hard in a disciplined manner.






VISION:

ADMISSION PROCESS

The West Bengal Higher Education department has decided to put in place a centralized portal for online admission to undergraduate degree courses in state-run and state-aided colleges and universities.

As part of the new system, a student can apply to any state aided institution through a central portal rather than logging into the admission portal of a particular institution.

Details of admission process through the central portal are given in the college website www.nsmashoknagar. ac.in. Admission to 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th semester is done by the college via its stand alone portal.

CHANGE OF STREAM AND SUBJECTS:

Candidates are advised to be extremely cautious while selecting streams, subjects, etc. before taking admission. Prayer for change of subject may be permitted as per WBSU guidelines.

COLLEGE EXAMINATION:

The college conducts internal examination in Major/Minor Courses. Apart from this examination, the students are advised to sit for class tests when conducted by a teacher. The practical examination for the science stream is taken based on continuous evaluation in the practical classes. Attendance is mandatory in the practical classes. Long absence may result in loss of marks. Absence in any of these examinations/ tests will be considered a break of the academic discipline of the college and is to be seriously dealt with.






NSM Film club in association with the college central library screening Ray's Hirak Rajar Deshe

LIBRARY FACILITIES

The Central Library has access to online resources via NLIST which is an initiative of Ministry of Human Resource Development under National Mission on Education through ICT to extend e-resources to colleges in India. Our students and faculty members have been using this online resource containing over 6000+ e-journals and 1,99,500+ e-books. As a member of the NDL (National Digital Library), all students and teachers of our college can access it for free. They can use various educational resources, research papers, e-books, journals, and other academic materials available on the platform. Photocopying and printing facilities are also available at a subsidized rate for our students and teachers. A story book section is also available at the reading room for the readers who wish to spend some time reading some literary stuff between classes. The college library organises different book-talk programmes on books like Harry Potter novels, "Things Fall Apart", etc. to encourage students.





STUDENT MENTORING: BRIDGING THE GAP BETWEEN THE TEACHERS AND STUDENTS

The mentoring system is one of the best practices of the college. The teacher-mentors play crucial role in guiding the students. Along with that, they provide information regarding scholarships, examination and other academic and cultural events. For the academic year 2024-25, a total number of 46 teachers are serving as mentors for 1,418 students. Students, enrolled in Major Course are guided by the faculty of respective departments. General students are divided into groups, and specific mentors are assigned to each group. To facilitate communication, mentors create WhatsApp groups where they share essential updates. Additionally, mentors inform students about important matters through phone calls.







EXHIBITION



The Department of Geography organized an exhibition (04/07/2024) on geographical innovations with the help of students. This exhibition helped the students to gain a lot of knowledge. Nearby school students were invited to see the exhibition and they showed considerable interest in the subject as well. The Music Department also organized an exhibition on November 28, 2024, where various musical instruments were showcased using models. The Education Department organized an exhibition on February 28, 2025. A model exhibition on

the educational philosophies of Rabindranath Tagore and Friedrich Froebel from the east and the west was held on that day. All this exhibitions provided an opportunity for the students to gain knowledge.





FEE CONCESSION

The college took the initiative to provide concession to the students across all semesters. The college reduces fee amounts under various categories such as admission, tuition, development, computer fees, practical, sports etc. Special student aid for admission to various semesters are provided to students who apply for it through their mentors or via students' council and was thereby verified to give the maximum benefit to the most disadvantaged and needy of all. In general the college authority provides fee-concessions to meritorious students as well as to good sports persons enrolled in our college.

STUDENT SCHOLARSHIP

The college provides services by facilitating the applications of Students' for government scholarships like Kanyashree prakalpa, Swami Vivekananda Scholarship, Aikashree, OASIS, TSP, Post-metric, NSP and many others. The college office staff, students' welfare unit and SC, ST, OBC and Minority Cell members work diligently to provide the students with the necessary information, distribute forms and verify the applications.

SOCIAL OUTREACH PROGRAMS

NSS AND EXTENSION COMMITTEE

The NSS unit of the college has been actively working to instil the spirit of community service and social responsibility. NSS volunteers plant trees to spread environmental awareness, publish regularly the 'Swachh' journal, clean the surrounding areas, organiz awareness programs on Thalassaemia and also organized antitobacco campaigns, etc.

An extension activity of an academic institution refers to community engagement programs that go beyond the regular academic curriculum to serve society. To apply knowledge and skills for social development, creating awareness, and solving real social problems are the aims of these social activities. As part of the Dengue Awareness Campaign, Netaji Satabarshiki Mahavidyalaya distributed mosquito nets to needy people in the special ward of Ashoknagar Kalyangarh Municipality area in February 2025. The college authority successfully organizes this type of awareness programs every year.

DEDICATED FACULTY (REGULAR CLASSES AND SPECIAL ATTENTION TO STUDENTS)

Teachers take regular classes following the master routine and departmental routine under normal circumstance. Besides classroom teaching, teachers share e-resources and study materials through the LMS (Learning Management System) for helping them fine-tune their academic journey. In this regard, the YouTube and Facebook page of the college serve as crucial platforms for communication, engagement, and information sharing. The faculty utilizes these online platforms to showcase students' work, host and share educational contents and discussions and to stream several other academic and cultural programmes. Besides, experiential learning like educational tours, debate, quiz etc. are also part of academic integrity.

A smartboard has been installed recently at the Mahavidyalaya, a new initiative to make teaching-learning more engaging and easier for our students.

INTER-DISCIPLINARY LECTURES



Apart from the conventional teaching-learning process, the departments organize inter-disciplinary lectures so that the topics under study are better understood and the students can have a holistic understanding of the social and natural worlds. In the present scenario when the world is full of issues which are complex, challenging to solve and even hard to define, these inter disciplinary lectures help our students in developing various intellectual skills, like advanced critical thinking, integration, synthesis, and ability to approach and address these problems in a different perspective by effectively connecting the disparate realms of information and knowledge provided by discrete disciplines.

STUDENT CENTRIC E-LEARNING: LMS (LEARNING MANAGEMENT SYSTEM)



The college utilizes an online portal (https://erp. nsmashoknagar.ac.in) as a virtual interaction platform for students and teachers. Through this portal, teachers can assign homework, conduct class tests, and upload study materials for students to access. This system facilitates teaching, learning, evaluation, and compilation processes by serving as a digital repository for all interactions between teachers and students across all semesters. Overall, the LMS enhances the educational experience for both advanced and slow learners by making learning process more accessible, organized, and effective.

SEMINARS AND WORKSHOPS

Academic seminars and webinars are regularly organized in our college by different departments and committees. Teachers and students participate in the various state, national, and international level seminars & workshops enthusiastically. The College IQAC encourages such academic initiatives to boost the scholastic mind.









COMPUTER TRAINING COURSE

From 2016-17, a "Basic Computer Course" has been offered to 3rd semester students irrespective of streams at a very nominal cost. For this purpose, the institution has decided to upgrade the infrastructural facilities by providing access to computers and free Wi-Fi connectivity to all students within the campus. This initiative helps our students to develop their technical skills.

VOCATIONAL COURSE

In the academic session 2021-22, our college, in collaboration with Webel, introduced a mobile repairing course spanning 3 months for the students with an aim to enhance their vocational skills which helped them to secure employment or even start a business venture of their own while studying and thus provide for themselves and their families.

EDUCATIONAL TOUR

Together with the usual classroom teaching and outdoor practical classes, educational tours of the departments are arranged to different places of educational and historical importance. In this academic session, several departments organized such tours and created exciting opportunities for our students to experience art and culture first-hand and appreciate at a much deeper level than they ever could in the classroom.















FACILITATING SCHOLARSHIPS

The college office provides application forms of "Kanyashree Prakalpa" (a conditional cash transfer scheme under the Department of Women Development and Social Welfare, Government of West Bengal) and which is aimed at improving the status and well-being of the girl children in West Bengal by innervating schooling of teenage girls. Apart from that, the college assists with two other state government-sponsored scholarships. One is the "Swami Vivekananda Scholarship", which is a scheme for the meritorious

and economically backward students and the other which is for the meritorious students from minority community. In this way, students can apply for all types of Govt. scholarships with the help of the college office staff and under the proper supervision of SC/ ST/ OBC & Minority Cell. In the academic session, 2024-25 a total number of 920 students received government scholarships amounting to Rs. 8956000.



FEES CONCESSION

Concession in fees and free studentship are granted on the basis of merit cum means under the existing rules. Defaulters in stipulated attendance will not be entertained for such concession. Students applying for the concession of fees must submit their applications with supporting documents in prescribed format within the notified date.

STUDENT-CENTRIC IMPORTANT COMMITTEES & CELLS

There are different committees to address student problems and raise awareness

CAREER COUNSELLING CELL

The cell has been established to counsel and guide our students regarding career opportunities in their respective areas. While our teachers help out by offering information and other related data on a regular basis, the invited career counselors also visit our college to discuss diverse career plans and help to develop the job skills of the students.

Unique hands-on practice workshop was conducted in collaboration with Fevicol Pidilite for our students. They learned how to decorate waste items into decorative items through recycling process.

In this picture Career Counselling Cell with IQAC of Netaji Satabarshiki Mahavidyalaya organized a professional skill development program in collaboration with Tally Academy. The program was organized to motivate our students about their career goals by providing them skill based practical knowledge. Students were enthusiastically participated in this career oriented professional skill development program.

INTERNAL COMPLAINTS COMMITTEE (ICC)

The college has constituted Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) as per the UGC guidelines to receive and redress complaints on sexual harassment at workplace.

MINORITY CELL

Following the UGC regulations, Netaji Satabarshiki Mahavidyalaya has set up a cell for the minority students with representatives from the teachers and the non-teaching staff. The objectives of the cell are to look into the general welfare and progression of minority students. Like previous year, in this year also the cell organized webinars to make our students aware of different types of central and state scholarships.

ANTI-RAGGING COMMITTEE

The college administration along with the students & other stakeholders has put in place an Anti-Ragging Committee for building and preserving a culture of Ragging-Free Environment at campus. The functions of Anti- Ragging committee is to keep a strict vigil, prevent the incidences of ragging and most importantly to create awareness amongst the students about the ill effects of ragging. The committee also educates the students by adopting various means like class campaigns exhibiting posters or organizing programmes regarding the menace of ragging and the related punishments.

GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL

In order to promote and maintain a conducive and harmonious educational environment among the students, the Grievance Redressal Cell of our college looks into the complaints lodged by the students. They can voice any kind of discontent or dissatisfaction regarding academic and non-academic matters in the college campus freely and frankly without any fear of victimization. Complaint Boxes are installed in the college campus in which they can drop their complaints in writing or they can submit their complaints via email. In this respect, mentors play a vital role in showing the ways in which he/she can lodge complaint and ask for redressal and also giving moral support to their mentees. The Cell addresses their grievances promptly with an impartial and fair approach.

NSS UNIT & EXTENSION PROGRAMME

The NSS unit plays a pivotal role to instill social responsibility in the students thereby preparing them for real life situations and facilitating a holistic development of the students. Various extension programmes stimulate students' awareness in various aspects of life such as health and well-being, ecocentric living, patriotism, cleanliness etc. The students who are admitted as NSS volunteers do not stay confined within the college premises but visit the neighbouring localities to carry out various outreach programmes such as Anti-Tobacco campaign, Thalassemia awareness and Screening programme, Clean nature-Green nature, Swachchta Hi Seva, Ban Mahotsav etc. are propagated to the local communities. Free health check-up camps and sanitation programmes in the adopted village are organised by the NSS unit of the college. Students also participate in Republic day parades and various government events such as distribution of Student Credit Cards etc.

STUDENT HEALTH HOME




